Death in recent weeks has removed a number of Hackettstown's citizens of mark. The community regrets the passing so suddenly of Mrs. Catherine Adella Martin at her home on High street, Hackettstown, last Thursday morning from a general physical relapse following a brief illness from a cold. Mrs. Martin was a woman of vigorous temperament and qualities of leadership and found enjoyment and unflinching satisfaction in her family circles and the loyal friendship of an acquaintance much appreciated.

She was the youngest surviving daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. John R. Carr and all her life of sixty-seven years was spent in Hackettstown. In early life she married Dr. Alden E. Martin, who survives at the advanced age of past eighty-one. Her married life of more than three score years was spent in the High street home from which her funeral services were held at 2:30 Saturday afternoon. Burial was in the family plot in Hackettstown Union cemetery.

Mrs. Martin was a communicant of St. James' Episcopal Church, Hackettstown, and the rector, Rev. J. Marshall Wilson, conducted the funeral services. She was a member of the Woman's Guild of her church and of the Monday Evening Club. The profusion of flowers sent by relatives and friends were silent expressions of love and esteem.

Mrs. Martin leaves three daughters, Mrs. M. L. Fletcher of High street, Mrs. J. Gilbert Stout of Church street and Mrs. Ashton Davis of Los Angeles; a son, Dr. Carr Martin of Brooklyn, and two sisters, Mrs. Anna C. Sharp of Grand avenue and Mrs. Ella C. Vescehus of High street.
