

CARL ARTHUR MAXWELL PHILLIPSBURG

Memorial services were held Sunday (Sept. 26) for Dr. Carl Arthur Maxwell, 65, of 522 Barrymore St., who died Friday (Sept. 24) at Allentown and Sacred Heart Hospital, Pa.

Born in Macon, Ga., Sept. 29, 1910, he was a son of the late Carl Allen and Maria McKay McMillan Maxwell.

He was a graduate of Washington Missionary College, Washington, D.C., and the College of Medical Evangelists, Los Angeles, Calif.

Practicing orthopedic surgery in Phillipsburg and Morristown at the time of his death, he formerly had a practice in Hackettstown.

An Army officer during and after World War II, he was a former chief of the physiotherapy department at Camp Kilmer.

He was also chief of physical medicine and rehabilitation at the Veterans Administration Hospital, Lyons. Another post he held was associate medical director at the Kessler Institute for Rehabilitation, West Orange.

Maxwell was a fellow of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons and the International and American Colleges of Surgeons.

A member of the state rehabilitation commission, he was on the board of trustees of Hackettstown Community Hospital and a member of the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

Survivors include his widow, Helen Wenz Maxwell; a daughter, Susan of West Chester, Pa.; two sisters, Mrs. Virginia Neuschel of Lake Forest, Ill., and Mrs. Betty Grosch of Sparta; and a brother, Thomas of Gladhill.

Services were at the First Presbyterian Church, Phillipsburg, Pa.
