Jacob McCracken.

Jacob McCracken died quite suddenly at his home in Philadelphia last Saturday morning of pheumonia. He had been sick just a week, and Friday night a specialist was called in more to relieve his discouragement than in belief that his condition was critical. Saturday morning his wife had left him but a short time, and on her return found him unconscious, and he expired a few minutes later.

Deceased was in the 55th year of his age, a son of the late William Mc-Crecken, and most of his life was spent in Hackettstown. He was a Woodworkman and carpenter by trade, and several years ago he went to Dover in the car shops, and a year and a half ago went to Phiadelphia.
