### Amos McLean.

Amos McLean after a long sickness died at his home on Moore street on Wednesday in the eightieth year of his age. Mr. McLean was for years a successful carriage manufacturer in Hackettstown and erected years ago the building now known as the Central House. Afterward he was engaged in the car shops of the Lackawanna Railroad at Dover and at the American Saw Mill.

Mr. McLean was a member of Independence Lodge, F. and A. M., and also Musconetcong Lodge, I. O. O. F. He had been Master of the Masonic lodge. When the civil war broke out he volunteered, but though he saw active service he never was wounded. Mr. McLean was born at Drakestown, one of a family of eight children. The last survivor is George McLean, of Princeton, Ill. He leaves a widow, who was Miss Anna Trumbower, and one son, Henry T., of Hartford, Conn.

For many years Mr. McLean was a member of Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church. The pastor, the Rev. Dr. J. O. Sparnon, will conduct the funeral services, to be held this Friday afternoon at half-past two o'clock.
