

## Mildred K. Barker, teacher, principal

Mildred K. Barker, 95, of Hackettstown, died Thursday, May 1, in Poughkeepsie, N.Y., at the home of her daughter.

She was a schoolteacher and principal, employed by the Hackettstown Board of Education in Hackettstown until she retired.

Born June 16, 1901, in Succasunna, N.J., she was a daughter of the late Edward W. and Elizabeth M. Fancher Kilpatrick. She lived in Hackettstown all her life.

She was a member of First Presbyterian Church in Hackettstown, where she served as an elder.

She was a founder of the Hackettstown Historical Society and the Warren County Retired Teachers Association, and was active in the Republican Party. She was a member of the General William Maxwell Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, a member of the Hackettstown Women's Club, and was a member of the Hackettstown Garden Club. She was a jury commissioner and a state committeewoman.

Her husband, Harold A., died earlier.

She is survived by a daughter, Elizabeth R. Hotchkiss of Poughkeepsie; four grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

Memorial services will be held at 1 p.m. Monday in the church, Main Street, Hackettstown. There will be no calling hours.

Burial will be in Hackettstown Union Cemetery in Hackettstown.
