## Dr. Geo. G. Mills, Dean Of Physicians

Expires In His 77th Year After 37 Of Practice In Hackettstown

Funeral services were held in the First Presbyterian Church yesterday afternoon for Dr. George Grant Mills, 76, of 228 Main Streef, oldest practicing physician in Warren County, who died at 12:45 a. m. Monday, Nov. 17, 1947, at Morristown Memorial Hospital. He had been a surgical patient there for three

Before he turned to medicine, Dr. Mills was graduated from West Chester Normal School and served as a school principal at Bethlehem. He then attended the Medico-Chirulogical College in Philadelphia, now part of the University of Pennsylvania, where he was graduated in 1905.

In Hackettstown Dr. Mills was a member of the First Presbyterian Church, the Daughters of Liberty, and Independence Lodge, No. 42, F and A. M. He had served on the Board of Health since 1932. He was a member of the Warren County and New Jersey Medical Societies and the American Medical Association.

Only survivors are his second wife, Mrs. Grace Hoffnagle Mills, and a niece, Mrs. William L. Leattor of Riegelsville, Pa. His first wife, nee Hazel Young, died in 1937.

Masonic services were conducted Tuesday evening at the Cochran Funeral Home. Officiating at the funeral yesterday was the Rev. Andrew M. Sebben of the Presbyterian Church. Committal rites in Union Cemetery were conducted by Dr. Mills' brother-in-law, the Rev. Phillips Brooks Fianklin, Episcopal clergyman of Millville.
