OBITUARY

John B. Mucklow, 91 years old, probably the oldest male resident of this valley, certainly the oldest native of Hackettstown, died at the old Mucklow homestead on Main street at three o'clock p.m. on Tuesday. He was the oldest son of Peter and Nancy Brown Mucklow, who were among the carliest settlers. Mrs. Phoebe Apgar and Mrs. Harriet-Egbert, twin sisters: at the age of 82 survive.

John B. Mucklow has practically lived his whole life in Hackettstown, succeeding his father in the old-fashioned hatting business, and by inheritance and purchase succeeding to the old homestead, which he has occupied and maintained until his death. He was the first town clerk of the town and held many other offices of local importance that evidenced the confidence and honor in which he was held by his contemporaries.
