

Harry G. Nolan Passes Away Following Operation.

After an affliction of long standing and of which he never complained, Harry G. Nolan was compelled to consult his physician and upon his advice was admitted to the Easton General Hospital. His case was acute and he was operated on at once for ulcers of the stomach. Not much hope was offered his many friends and relatives, but he rallied and lingered for a week when his condition suddenly grew worse and the end came Sunday morning.

Harry G. Nolan's is one of the oldest established business places on Main street. He served as clerk and finally purchased the William F. Kluppelberg business. Later he moved the business to the Harris block where it has remained since.

He had filled the position of secretary to the Board of Water Commissioners for a long term of years and had acted as their collector.

He was a member of Vigilant Hook & Ladder Co., the Hackettstown Club, and a member of Independence Lodge, No. 42, F. and A. M. of 29 years standing, and these organizations attended his funeral with Masonic honors at the grave.

He is survived by his wife, and a sister residing in Phillipsburg. Funeral services were held at his late home, 117 High street, Thursday afternoon. Rev. H. R. Breisch, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church, officiated. Interment was in Union Cemetery.
