

MRS. ELIZABETH W. ORR
RICHMOND, IND. — Word has been received of the death of Mrs. Elizabeth W. Orr, 48, of 312 College Ave., following a long illness.

She moved here from Hackettstown in July 1976.

A former concert pianist, she gave private music lessons. Many years ago, she accompanied the choral singers at Centenary College for Women, Hackettstown, until students began accompanying the choirs themselves.

Her husband, William M., now director of the Yorkfellow Academy, taught religion and philosophy at Centenary from 1956 through 1976. She aided him in advising United for Others, a service organization, and the Guild, a religious and philanthropic organization.

The Orrs directed a Methodist student project in Seattle, Wash., during the summer of 1959.

Mrs. Orr was a graduate of the Royal Academy of Music in Scotland and taught in the Dundee schools in Scotland. She was a member of Central Methodist Church here.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by two daughters, Miss Katharine Orr of Albuquerque, N.M., and Mrs. David Curtin of Richmond; two brothers James Webster and David Webster, both of Scotland, and nieces.

Funeral arrangements were handled by the Doan and Mills Funeral Home, Richmond.
