John L. Pace

Services were held for John L. Pace, 79, of Hackettstown, who died Oct. 30 at his home after a long illness.

He was born in Gladstone and lived in the Hackettstown area most of his life. He was a maintenance man at Hackettstown Community Hospital until 1981, when he retired.

He served with the U.S. Navy in World War II.

He was a member of Anderson United Methodist Church, Mansfield Township; a past commander of the VFW Post in Netcong; and an active leader with the Boy Scouts in Hackettstown for many years. He served as ranger at Camp Pahaquarra, George Washington Council #17, of the Boy Scouts.
