Jane Park Dies At 42 In Hackettstown Home

HACKETTSTOWN — Funeral of her family and several local residents appeared on the television program "Strike It Rich" as part of the appeal. services for Miss Jane Park, 42, of 317 Sharp Street, Hackettstown, will be held tomorrow at 2 p. m. in Trinity Methodist Church. She was born May 9, 1924 in Dover, the daughter of Mrs. Dellaphine Bell Park and the late Joseph Warren Park, and lived in Hackettstown all her life.

Miss Park, who was known as Hackettstown's Valentine Sweetheart, died Tuesday morning at her home. She was confined to her bed with rheumatoid arthritis for 26 years since she was stricken at the age of 16. She belonged to Trinity Methodist Church and was an honorary member of the auxiliaries of the Hackettstown Fire Department and the Hackettstown Rescue Squad. She also was a member of the Sigma Epsilon Phi Sorority of Centenary College for Women, Hackettstown.

A number of years ago, a group of friends and community organizations launched an annual Jane Park Day and fund drive, held during February, to help defray her medical expenses. She is survived by her mother and two sisters, Miss Barbara H. Park, of Hackettstown, and Mrs. Robert C. Phillips, of Pennington.
