HACKETTSTOWN — Clara Pfouth, 91, died Friday, Sept. 12, 2003, in St. Clare's Compassionate Care Center in Dover.

Born Oct. 12, 1911, in Hope, she was a daughter of the late Jesse Ort and Martha Sebring.

Her first husband, Lewis M. Filburn, died in 1989, and her second husband, Theodore Pfouth, died in November 1974.

Clara resided in the Hope and Great Meadows area for most of her life and for the past 29 years, resided in Hackettstown.

She was a homemaker whose entire focus was her family. She had also worked for a time at Hosiery Mill in Hope.

She was a member of her most favorite church, the Vienna Methodist Church in Vienna, where she spent her Sundays with her family.
