

Jacob "Jack" Popovich

A Mass of Christian Burial was said for Jacob "Jack" Popovich, 78, of Hackettstown, who died Feb. 2 at Hackettstown Community Hospital after a short illness.

Born in Johnstown, Pa., he lived most of his life in Hackettstown and was the proprietor of the Popovich Sign Service in Hackettstown.

He was also a postal worker, retiring in 1981.

Mr. Popovich served in the U.S. Army during World War II.

He was a member of St. Mary's Church of the Assumption in Hackettstown, the Joyce Kilmer Council, Knights of Columbus, Hackettstown; and the Blue Ridge Post 164 American Legion in Hackettstown.

He was a scratch league bowler in Morris, Warren and Sussex counties.

Mr. Popovich is survived by his wife, Constance; two daughters, Sandra Tuxhorn of Bushkill and Joan Mack of East Stroudsburg; two brothers, Charles Popovich of Johnstown, Pa., and Stephen Poppy of Milltown; and four grandchildren.

Interment was in Union Cemetery, Hackettstown. The Cochran Funeral Home of Hackettstown was in charge of arrangements.
