

HAROLD V. PUFFER

Services were conducted Tuesday afternoon for Harold V. Puffer, 59, of 24 Prospect Street, Andover, who died on Sunday, July 9, 1972, at Newton Memorial Hospital after a brief illness. His pastor, the Rev. Barry Smith of the Andover Methodist Church, officiated at the Smith-McCracken Funeral Home in Newton. Interment was in Tranquility Cemetery.

Born on July 4, 1913, in Allamuchy, Mr. Puffer was the son of the late Milford Puffer. He was a graduate of Hackettstown High School.

Owner and operator of the Puffer Insurance Agency, he had made his home in Andover for 32 years. He was a member of the Newton Elks' Lodge, the Branchville Businessmen's Club, the Sussex County Board of Realtors and was with the National Association of Mutual Insurance Agents.
