Charles M. Quinn, 84, of 4010 Ingraham St., Hyattsville, Md., formerly of Hackettstown, died Monday, March 25, in Atlantic City.

He had been business manager of Local 70, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, retiring 20 years ago.

Born Feb. 14, 1912, in Newark, he was a son of the late Matthew and Catherine Burke Quinn.

His wife, the former Katherine Vance, died Dec. 2, 1976.

He was a member of St. Jerome's Roman Catholic Church in Hyattsville.

He was a member of Prince Georges County Council of the Knights of Columbus, past president and senior member of the John Fitzgerald Kennedy, Division Five, Ancient Order of Hibernians of the District Board, and a member of Moose Lodge 453, College Park, Md.

During World War II, he spent time in Greenland in electrical construction and in Hanford, Wash., in a government facility connected with the Manhattan Project.

Surviving are two sisters, C.J. "Jane" O'Neill and Agnes Palmer, both of Hackettstown; and several nieces and nephews.

Three brothers, Francis, Charles P., and Thomas, and a sister, Mary, all died earlier.
