Third Member of Quinn Family Killed

The remains of James Quinn, of Port Morris, a Lackawanna brakeman, were brought here yesterday and interred in Union Cemetery. Last Friday night Quinn attempted to board a freight train at the Morris Street crossing of the Lackawanna railroad in Dover, and was thrown beneath its wheels. Later he was found lying along the track with his right thigh and left foot badly crushed, besides other bruises and cuts. Later he was taken to the hospital at Morristown, where he died at 3 o'clock Monday morning.

Three similar accidents have occurred in the Quinn family in a little more than a year. On the night of October 16, 1905, his father, Hugh Quinn, who formerly resided here, was struck by a train on the Central Railroad near Wharton and his body was literally cut to pieces and the dismembered parts were scattered along the track. On the afternoon of September 15, last, Owen Quinn, a brother, was run down by a trolley car at Wharton and a few days later died at a Morristown hospital. He was also attempting to board a moving car and injuries he received were very similar to those received by James Quinn last Friday night.

The deceased is survived by a mother, one brother and a sister.
