

OBITUARY

Amos S. Reed.

Amos Sardin Reed was stricken with apoplexy at his home on High street here Sunday, and died 21 hours later without regaining consciousness. Mr. Reed had reached the advanced age of 74 years, but was apparently in the full vigor of advanced years. He left his son-in-law's hardware store on Hope street earlier than usual Saturday night, complaining slightly, and retired immediately on reaching his home. Sunday morning he did not get up and join the family, complaining of shortness of breath and expressing no desire of lying in bed. He got up later, but remained in his room. At noon he was worse, and Dr. Farrior was hastily summoned, and when he arrived the patient was in a state of collapse. He revived under hypodermic treatment, was placed in bed, but never recovered consciousness. Death occurred at 4 o'clock Monday afternoon.

Mr. Reed established his home in Hackettstown twenty-eight years ago, coming here from his farm in Sussex county. For many years he engaged in the produce business, buying and shipping country produce and livestock. In this business he became well known throughout this entire rural section, and his business integrity had universal recognition. Mr. Reed's wife died a year ago last September, and he is survived by his two daughters, Mrs. George M. McClellan, of this town, and Mrs. Silas B. Hazen, of Newark.

The funeral services were held from his late home at 11 a. m. yesterday, and the remains were taken to Newton in the afternoon for interment.
