

Dr. Alfred E. Silber

Services were held Jan. 15 for Dr. Alfred E. Silber, 68, of Hackettstown, who died Jan. 14 at Overlook Hospital, Summit.

Born in Newark, Dr. Silber attended Barringer High School and was graduated from New York University Dental School in 1950. He lived and practiced family dentistry on Main Street in Hackettstown for 38 years.

Dr. Silber served in the U.S. Army Infantry Medical Corps and served in Hawaii and the occupying forces in Japan during World War II.

He was president of the Tri-County Dental Fraternity, Sigma Epsilon Delta, in 1962. He served on the Hackettstown Rescue Squad on its inception and was affiliated with the Masonic Lodge, Kiwanis Club and Hackettstown Community Hospital.

Dr. Silber was a member of the Jewish Center of Northwest Jersey in Washington and had served as a board member.

Surviving are his wife, Teo; a son, Mark Silber of Metuchen; two daughters, Cheryl Silber of Morristown and Bonnie Willner of Parsippany; and two grandchildren.
