

JOHN M. SLIKER

WADLEY, Ga. — Graveside services were conducted Friday at the Wadley Cemetery for John M. Sliker, 49-year-old well known racing pilot, who died Sept. 16 when his plane crashed in Flagstaff, Ariz. The Rev. Riley Middleton officiated.

Born in Glen Ridge, N.J., Sliker was returning home from the National Championship Air Races in Reno, Nev., when his plane crashed. He had placed third in the race.

A World War II veteran, Sliker had served in the U.S. Army Air Force. He had lived in Wadley for 18 years and owned and operated a flying service and crop dusting business. He was a Cessna Aircraft dealer in Louisville, Ga.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Madeline Honnell Sliker, Wadley; his mother, Mrs. Gertrude Sliker, of Hackettstown; a sister and a brother, Mrs. Jane Petty and Robert Sliker, both of Hackettstown.
