

Mrs. Smith Dies At Heath Village

HACKETTSTOWN — Mrs. Dorothy Cook Smith, of Hatcher Road, died Wednesday at Heath Village, where she had been living for five years.

Born in Brooklyn, N. Y., she lived in the Hackettstown area most of her life. Her husband, Charles A. Smith died in 1960.

Mrs. Smith was chairman of the Hackettstown Recreation Commission, having been a member at its founding. She was also a member of the Hackettstown Junior High School Education for the 10th district, served as vice president during the building of the present school, in 1959.

She was a member of the Hackettstown election board for 20 years and a charter member of Blue Ridge Post 164 American Legion Auxiliary. A member of the First Presbyterian Church of Hackettstown, she was kindergarten superintendent of the Sunday School there for 35 years. She was a past president of the Hackettstown Woman's Club, was an advisor of the Hackettstown Junior High School, and was a member of the 10th district of the Hackettstown Junior High School.

Mrs. Smith attended Pennsylvania State College for three and a half years and was a resident counselor for the B. Anderson Hall in 1965. She was a candidate for New Jersey Mother of the Year in 1966.

She is survived by one son, Charles A. Jr., of Verona; three daughters, Mrs. Donald Morris of Edina, Minn.; Mrs. Richard Long, of Miami, Fla.; and Mrs. Gordon Brown, of Verona; 14 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Funeral services will be at 10 a.m. at the First Presbyterian Church, Main Street, Hackettstown. Arrangements were made by Cochran Funeral Home, Hackettstown. In lieu of flowers, the family wishes a donation to Hackettstown Community Hospital.
