Born in Waterloo, Mr. Smith was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Seymour Smith. His father was a founder and director of the Hackettstown National Bank.

Historic Store

Mr. Smith was proprietor of the old Smith general store at Waterloo more than 30 years until his retirement more than 20 years ago. The store, located at the edge of the old Morris and Essex Canal, was in operation here more than 100 years. The store was founded by his great-grandfather, who was a founder of the community of Waterloo.
