# Many Friends Mourn Passing of Fred R. Snyder

**Funeral Held Monday With Interment in Newton—Very Well-Known Here**

Fred Roof Snyder passed away at his home, 209 Grand avenue, Hackettstown, Thursday, January 23, after a protracted illness lasting over ten weeks.

Specialists were called in consultation shortly after he was taken ill, but gave no hope for his recovery.

Mr. Snyder was a native of Lafayette and came to Newton as a young man where he engaged in business, first as a member of Roof and Snyder. Later he opened a men's furnishing store. He resided in Newton altogether twenty-seven years. About eleven years ago he purchased the garage and business of William G. Vey on Main street, and conducted it at the time of his death.

While in Newton he was active in civic and municipal affairs; being a member of the Board of Education and acting as president of that body.

Mr. Snyder was a member of the Episcopal Church of Newton; a member of Harmony Lodge, No. 8, F. & A. M.; Tall Cedars of Lebanon; Elks; Kittatinny Hose Company; I. O. O. F., and Men's Club, and the Musconetcong County Club of Hackettstown.

Funeral services were held at his home on Monday, presided over by the Rev. J. K. Easley with interment in Newton Cemetery.

His survivors are Miss Margaret and William, at home, and Raymond, of 429 Washington street, who was associated with him in business; one sister, Mrs. Levi H. Morris, of Newton.

Mrs. Snyder died November 20, 1935. Both Mr. and Mrs. Snyder were prominent in social circles and leave many friends who mourn their loss.
