

MRS. MAY OSBURN SNYDER DIES AFTER LONG ILLNESS

Mrs. May Osburn Snyder, wife of Fred R. Snyder, passed away at her home, 209 Grand avenue, Wednesday after an illness of three years, when she was first afflicted.

Mr. and Mrs. Snyder spent their entire married life of 32 years in Newton and Hackettstown.

As a young woman and a young matron she was active in the church activities of Christ's Episcopal Church, Newton, of which she was a member and held many official positions in both civic and social organizations.

Upon their removal to Hackettstown Mrs. Snyder took an active interest in St. James' Episcopal Church affairs: was a member of the Dutch Treaters, entertaining lavishly, and was a social leader until her health broke and she was compelled to lead a quiet life.

The saddest circumstance that adds to the sorrow of the family is that her husband has been confined to the home for the past four weeks.

The survivors are her husband, three children, Raymond, and William Osburn, and Miss Margaret Catherine, all of Hackettstown, and one brother, Edward Osburn of Newton.

Funeral services will be held at her late home Saturday afternoon at 2:30, presided over by the Rev. Dr. Robert J. Trevorrow, president of Junior College, and the Rev. James K. Easley, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church.
