Kathryn Feeney Squier, 82, of the House of the Good Shepherd in Hackettstown, formerly of Florham Park, N.J., and Madison, N.J., died Tuesday, Feb. 10, in the home.

She was a secretary in New York City for many years and then the secretary to the mayor of Florham Park for several years.
