Evelyn J. Stackhouse

Evelyn J. "Eppie" Stackhouse, 65, of Hardwick, died Oct. 15, 2009 at Hackettstown Regional Medical Center after a long illness.

Born Oct. 1, 1944 in Brooklyn, she was a daughter of the late Carl and Loretta Crosswell Binder.

Mrs. Stackhouse lived in Mansfield Township before moving to Hardwick Township 32 years ago. She was a social worker at Grey-stone Park Psychiatric Hospital in Parsippany for 32 years, retiring in 2002.

She also was an adjunct professor of social work at New York University.

A 1965 graduate of Centenary College in Hackettstown, Mrs. Stackhouse received a bachelor's degree in history from Valparaiso (Ind.) College in 1967 and a master of social work degree from Rutgers University.

She was a deaconess of Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Hackettstown, where she was a member of the Altar Guild and church choir, former Sunday school teacher and former Vacation Bible School teacher. Mrs. Stackhouse was best known for her passion and love for domestic animals, wildlife and flowers.

She was preceded in death by a sister, Loretta Camporini.

Surviving are her husband, Charles, whom she married May 29, 1971; a brother, August Binder of Nazareth, Pa.; and eight nieces and nephews.

Services were held Oct. 19 at Gethsemane Lutheran Church with Pastor Terry Herzberg officiating. Interment was in Pequest Union Cemetery, Great Meadows.
