Funeral services were held recently for Mrs. Nellie Goddard Steinhilper, 95, who died June 22.

Mrs. Steinhilper was a resident of Summit for 13 years and was active in the College Club, the Red Cross, and the Women's Guild of China Church. She had lived in Roselle for many years and had served as president of the Board of Education and the Clio Club and served as an officer in the Red Cross and as an executive board member of the Baptist Church. Also formerly of Hackettstown, Mrs. Steinhilper served as a regent of the DAR, a teacher of the Adult Bible Study Group of the Methodist Church, was a member of the Women's Guild and worked with the Red Cross.

She spent her childhood in China, where the Goddard family had been medical missionaries.

She attended the Bucknell Female Seminary and Bucknell University, from which she graduated cum laude in 1905. She was one of the founders of Delta Delta Delta Sorority at Bucknell in 1902.

She taught classical

languages to young black women in preparation for college entrance at Spellman Seminary in Atlanta, Georgia, prior to her marriage in 1907.

She is survived by two sons, John Ripley of Brainard, N.Y., and Frank Abbott of Lincoln, Mass.; a daughter, Mrs. E. Wallace Wilkins of Summit; nine grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren.

Burial was in the Hackettstown Union Cemetery, at the convenience of the family.

The family memorial in her name is being given to the Library of Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Pa.
