## Gilbert Stout, Was Postmaster For 12 Years

HACKETTSTOWN—J. Gilbert Stout, 67, of 400 Church St., who retired in 1961 as postmaster of Hackettstown after serving 12 years, died unexpectedly Friday afternoon en route to the Morristown Memorial Hospital.

Mr. Stout, president of the Hackettstown Coal & Supply Co., was stricken at his office and Dr. Edward Minier was summoned. Dr. Minier ordered the Rescue Squad to transport him to the hospital.

Mr. Stout was chairman of the board of directors on the Hackettstown National Bank and was a former member of the Board of Education and a councilman.

He was also a member of St. James Episcopal Church, the Union Cemetery Association; Blue Ridge Post, 164, American Legion and the Democratic Club, all of Hackettstown.

Survivors include his widow, the former Augusta Martin; three sons, Gilbert M., of Chatham; Bruce C. and Richard S., of Hackettstown, and 10 grand-children.

The funeral was held Tuesday at 2 p. m. in St. James Episcopal Church and interment was in the Union cemetery.
