

Edward Eli Stover

WASHINGTON — Funeral services were held Feb. 8 at the First Presbyterian Church of Washington for Edward Eli Stover, 76, of Washington, who died Feb. 5 at home.

Mr. Stover was born in Easton, Pa., and lived in Washington all his life.

He was an attorney-at-law and president of Stover & Stover. He retired in July 1991.

Mr. Stover opened his law practice in 1938 after he graduated from Washington & Lee University and School of Law, Lexington, Va., in 1937.

He was a member and past president of the New Jersey State Bar Association and past member of the state Judiciary Committee. He was also a former borough attorney and a former Franklin Township attorney.

Mr. Stover was past master of Mansfield Lodge 36 Free & Accepted Masons, Washington. He was director of the former First National Bank of Washington, and a board member of First Fidelity Bank, N.A.

He was the first Eagle Scout in Warren County, a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Washington and a past deacon and elder of the church.

He is survived by his wife, the former Dorothy Thomas; three sons, Thomas E. of Washington R.D., Richard E. of Morristown and Edward E. II of West Hurley, N.Y.; a daughter, Mary Ellen Stover of Purcellville, Va.; 13 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Burial was in Washington Cemetery.
