

## Alma W. Timbrell, 105, former piano teacher

HACKETTSTOWN — Alma W. Timbrell, 105, of Hackettstown, died Friday, Aug. 12, in the House of the Good Shepherd.

She taught piano from her home until the age of 96.

Born Jan. 4, 1889, in Ledge-wood, N.J., she was a daughter of the late Samuel and Almira Clouse Wilkinson.

She lived in Stanhope before moving to Hackettstown 50 years ago.

She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Hackettstown where she was a former Sunday school teacher and choir member.
