Retired Teacher Is Dead At 62

62, of Apartment 117, Riverside Gardens, Mountain Avenue, Hackettstown, a retired Hackettstown High School teacher, died after a long illness in Morristown Memorial Hospital on Monday, May 3, 1971. She was hospitalized five days ago.

Mrs. Torrence, the wife of Charles L. Torrence, retired in 1966 as a history teacher at Hackettstown High School for 22 years. She was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church.

Born August 22, 1908, in Newark, she was a daughter of Mrs. Mattie Schenck Hibler of Monroe Street, Hackettstown, and the late Andrew Hibler. She spent most of her life in Hackettstown.
