

Andrew W. Trimmer.

Andrew W. Trimmer passed away at the home of his son, Montgomery R. Trimmer, *81 Dorien Road, Westfield, last Sunday, at the mature age of eighty-five years.

Mr. Trimmer was a native of Middle Valley, where he spent his boyhood. His first position was with the hardware firm of the W. W. Woodward Co., of Newton. After which he came to Hackettstown as a clerk for W. L. and G. W. Johnson, where he remained for a number of years.

His next move was to manage the jewelry business of T. G. Plate, while he was absent in Europe. After which he built and established himself in a stationery store on the corner of Plane and Main streets. His next venture was to build the brick building at 165 Main street, where he moved his business and occupied it until he sold to Osmun & Weber. Afterwards he was interested in the creamery located on the Thomas farm.

He then entered the real estate and insurance field for a number of years, finally becoming interested in Stewart, Fla., property and disposed of the major part of his holdings here and made his home in Stewart about ten years ago. *C. 1924*

He married Miss Mollie Rea and survived her only a few months.

Mr. Trimmer was affiliated with the Presbyterian Church and for a number of years was the leading tenor in the choir and took a leading part in all church activities.

His only survivor is his son, M. R. Trimmer, of Westfield. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the home of his brother-in-law, C. V. S. Rea. Rev. James W. Martyn, pastor of the Presbyterian Church, officiating. Interment was in the family plot in Union Cemetery.
