William Trimmer.

William Trimmer, a man held in the highest esteem in this community, died at his home on Hope street at 8 o'clock Wednesday morning. Mr. Trimmer had been in failing health for more than a year and has been confined to his home since last November.

Mr. Trimmer was in the 75th year of his age, having been born at Mt. Bethel on July 7th, 1828. He came to Hackettstown when a young man and has lived here ever since. He secured employment in the construction of the M. and E. Railroad and took employment as a brakeman when the road was completed. He served as brakeman but a year and then was made a section foreman, and in this position served the M. and E. and its successor, the Lackawanna, for a period of forty years. Mr. Trimmer is survived by two younger brothers—John Q. Trimmer, of Missouri, and Isaac Trimmer, of this Town. His wife died about twenty years ago, but his three children survive.

Mrs. Thomas Hayes, of Andover; Mrs. T. S. White, of Hackettstown, and Frank Trimmer, of Morristown. The funeral services will be held from his late home at 2 p. m. on Saturday.
