

Clarence Tynan, longtime Hackettstown firefighter

HACKETTSTOWN — Clarence E. "Bub" Tynan, a 40-year member of the Hackettstown Fire Department, died yesterday at Morristown Memorial Hospital after a short illness. He was 61.

In June, Mr. Tynan was grand marshal of the 110th anniversary parade of Cataract Hose Co. No. 1, Hackettstown Fire Department, and recently was honored for 40 years of service.

Mr. Tynan and his family are celebrated as having the largest number of family members in a volunteer fire department in the United States, with combined service of 338 years.

He was chief of the Hackettstown Fire Department from 1973-74; treasurer of the Hackettstown Exempt Firemen's Association; a life member of the New Jersey State Exempt Firemen's Association; assistant secretary of the Hackettstown Firemen's Relief Association; and a member of the New Jersey State Fire Chiefs' Association.

He was born in Hackettstown, and lived most of his life in the area.

Mr. Tynan worked for the Hackettstown Department of Public Works.
