## Jacob Wiley. The funeral services of Jacob

Wiley, aged eighty-seven, Hackettstown's last Civil War veteran who died Sunday at his home on Church street, were held Wednesday at 2 p. m., at his home in charge of Rev. John S. Burton. Burial was in the Hackettstown Union Cemetery.

iMr. Wiley, who was a native of the Drakestown section of Morris County, married Miss Mary Batson, now deceased, of Budd Lake, in 1864 and in 1914 they celebrated their golden wedding anniversary.
