The first was titled "Embalming Notes", which is still used as a teaching aid and reference book within the mortuary colleges throughout the United States. His second book, entitled "The Marble", is a reflection of a soldier's wartime experiences in Burma and China during World War II.

He was a Free and Accepted Master Mason.
