

## Mrs. Catherine Woolever.

Mrs. Catherine Woolever, eighty-five years old on February 3d, died early Monday morning at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Rebecca Vogel, corner Lafayette and Franklin streets. Mrs. Woolever was the widow of Abraham Woolever and since the death of her husband has made her home with her children. She was a daughter of Rev. Henry C. Major, of Bridgeville, a school teacher and Methodist clergyman who preached in many pulpits during the old circuit riding days when preachers drove many miles over the country districts from church to church.

Mrs. Woolever is survived by four daughters and one son as follows: Mrs. William Caskey, of Phillipsburg; Mrs. Rebecca Vogel, Mrs. Thomas Nolan, Mrs. Elizabeth Johnson and Stewart Woolever, of Hackettstown.
