Luba Diana Yarmie, taught in P'burg and Hackettstown

Luba Diana Yarmie, 57, of Phillipsburg, died Oct. 22 in Charlotte, N.C., in a pedestrian-motor vehicle accident.

A former teacher at St. Mary's School in Hackettstown for several years, she attended Fordham University in New York, N.Y., at that time to earn a master's degree in social studies.

After moving to Phillipsburg in 1973, she taught elementary grades at St. Philip and St. James School as a substitute.

Born in New York City, she attended St. Basil's Academy in Fox Chase, Pa., graduating as class valedictorian. She graduated from Manor College in Fox Chase, and John Robert Powers finishing school and Katherine Gibbs secretarial school, both in New York City.

In the past 10 years, she devoted much of her time working for charitable organizations in the Lehigh Valley area, including Valley Wide Help of Bethlehem and Easton, YWCA of Easton and Allentown and American Red Cross of Bethlehem.

She and her husband, Alexander J. Yarmie Sr., were married for nearly 36 years.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by three sons, Alexander J. Jr. of Kirkland, Wash., Capt. Michael S. of Fort Monmouth, N.J., and Christopher P. of Los Angeles, Calif.; three daughters, Diana Victoria Torres of Charlotte, N.C., Lisette M. of Seattle, Wash., and Liuba M. of Easton; a brother, Dr. George Peltz of New York City; and two grandchildren.

Interment took place on Oct. 28 in Charlotte. The Hankins, Whittinger and Williams-Dearborn Funeral Service in Charlotte was in charge of arrangements.
